

**VILLAGE OF TIVOLI BOARD OF TRUSTEES  
REGULAR BOARD MEETING MINUTES  
November 20, 2024**

A meeting of the Village Board of Trustees was held on November 20, 2024 at the Historic Watts DePeyster Hall, Tivoli, NY. Mayor Griffith opened the regular meeting at 7:02 PM.

The Mayor asked all present at the meeting to rise for the Pledge of Allegiance.

**The Clerk's report included:**

- 589 Trash tags sold
- Two payrolls were processed by Village Treasurer, Bonnie Day
- Deputy Clerk/Planning & Zoning Secretary, Bonnie Day, has been working with the Planning Board lately, and there is a potential upcoming project with the Zoning Board of Appeals
- The Village Clerk's Office will be Closed on Thursday and Friday, November 28 & 29 to observe the Thanksgiving holiday
- Clerk Bruno mentioned Tivoli Fire Company, and that she will once again this year act as the Liaison for Tivoli Fire with Toys For Tots. The box is located at the firehouse, and they will be accepting toys through December 12, and on December 13 a representative from Toys For Tots will be picking everything up. Toys can be brought to the firehouse any Monday between 7:00 PM – 9:00 PM, or those wishing to donate can also get in touch with her.

On a motion by Trustee Mangieri, and seconded by Trustee Baldino, the Treasurer's Report for Abstract #6 in the amount of \$176,020.72 was approved. Trustee Mangieri moved that the bills be paid for the abstract as presented, Trustee Shilling seconded the motion, all in favor.

Deputy Mayor Majer talked about Historic Red Hook and Tivoli Bays.

**Mayor Griffith**

The announcement was made that Tivoli's Winterfest will be held on December 7, 2024, more information to come.

Mayor Griffith mentioned two trees will be taken down on Monument Hill soon, however, they will be replaced by trees that will be planted by the Tree Committee. This area is the gateway to the Village, and also of a historic nature as it stands as a tribute to the service of local men and

women.

The parking ordinance will be in effect November 15, 2024-April 1, 2025, and on-street parking is not permitted from 1:00 AM – 6:00 AM. Parking permits can be purchased in the Clerk's Office for \$25.00. This allows parking in the village municipal parking lots. This ordinance is to keep the streets clear during the winter months.

Mayor Griffith also offered residents a reminder of the noise and nuisance laws. Tickets were recently issued for noise and nuisance gatherings. He mentioned that people can get together with friends, however, everyone must still be respectful of their neighbors. The generator for Village Hall will be installed soon. Regardless of a power outage, the generator will ensure Village Hall can remain open.
